

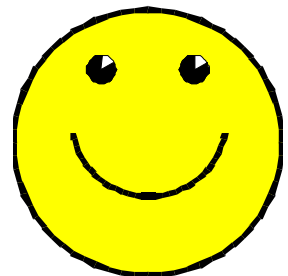


## Games for the Social Part of the Feast

'Abdu'l-Bahá said that we should give 'eloquent talks' at the Feast. Here's a way to get the members of your community practising.

- 1] Before the Feast starts cut up some small pieces of paper.
- 2] On each piece write a single word. These will be subjects for talks. Examples are: cats, travel teaching, fishing, living the life, jungles, etc. You could mix up Bahá'í subjects with other things.
- 3] When everyone's ready to play, put the papers in a bowl in the middle of the room.
- 4] Everyone takes a turn to throw a dice. Anyone who throws a six must take a paper from the bowl and talk on that subject for a whole minute. Someone with a second hand on their watch can be the timer.

### Make everyone happy



- 1] Give each person a piece of paper and a pencil.
- 2] Everyone writes their name on the top of the sheet, and passes it on to the next.
- 3] The new person looks at the name on top, and at the bottom of the sheet writes down one thing they like about that person.
- 4] The writing is folded over, and the sheet passed on to the next person.
- 5] As soon as they receive the sheet, everyone writes something they like about the person whose name is at the top, folds it over and passes it on.
- 6] When the sheets return to their owners they can be read quietly and taken home. The people can look at them when they need cheering up.
