

Questions on the letter of June 10, 1966 from the Universal House of Justice to the Bahá'í youth in every land

1. Who were the Knights of Bahá'u'lláh? (See p.92.)

2. Which do you think are the most important choices you will have to make during your "youthful years"? (See paragraph headed "A Time of Decision", pp.92-3.)

3. What does the House mean by "provide leadership for their and succeeding generations"?

4. How can youth contribute decisively to "the vitality, the purity and the driving force of the life of the Bahá'í community" (Shoghi Effendi)?

5. What was "the tenth part of [that majestic process described so vividly by our beloved Guardian]"? (See "A Critical Phase of Transition", pp.93-4.) For the answer, look at the opening words of the letter.

6. How has the Faith "emerged from obscurity" since this letter was written? Give some examples.

7. Has "the condition of the world, and the place of the Bahá'í Cause in it" already changed since 1966? What further changes do you expect to see during the lifetime of those who were young in 1966?

8. What are the "Three Fields of Service Open to Youth"? (See pp.94-5.) How do you feel about them? Which of these fields of service do you feel drawn to?

9. What ability must Bahá'í students develop, and why? (See "The Basis of All Knowledge", pp.95-6.)

10. How does the House suggest that Bahá'í youth should play their part in community life? (See "Function of Youth within the Community", pp.96-7.)

11. From the last paragraph of the letter ("Steps to Consider Now", p.97), what do you think the House would be asking the Bahá'í youth to do today?

12. How can you recognise the seekers among your contemporaries? How do you think they regard you?
